Dear Mr. Sombrotto:

On several occasions, the most recent on October 1, 1999, I met with your representative to discuss the above-captioned grievances at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in the instant grievances involves a local district policy to consider all vacant routes for reversion pursuant to the provisions of Article 41.1.A.1.

The parties agreed that a "blanket" policy to consider all vacant routes for reversion prior to posting is inconsistent with the provisions of Article 41.1.A.1. Routes considered for reversion are to be considered on a route by route basis.

Accordingly, it was agreed that the Connecticut Vacant Route Policy of December 8, 1998, as well as the March 23, 1999 revised policy, are to be rescinded.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case to the Dispute Resolution Team, through the NALC National Business Agent, for further processing and application of the above, including determination of remedy, if applicable.

Time limits at Step 4 were extended by mutual consent.
