On March 30, 2000, I met with your representative to discuss the above-referenced grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.


After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case, and that the JCAM, pages 8-18, 8-19 and the ELM 432.62 is applicable to the fact circumstances of the instant case.


Accordingly, the parties agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3, for further processing, including arbitration, if appropriate.
