Gentlemen:

As a result of our discussions on the above-captioned Step 4 grievance, the Postal Service agreed to revise the formula for computing the 150 and 200 or more work years of employment reports from 1,782 productive work years to 2,080 paid hours.

In accordance with our discussions and agreement on November 4, enclosed is a listing of offices, by state, with 150 or more man years of employment in the regular work force, and a listing of offices, by state, with 200 or more man years of employment in the regular work force. Both lists were compiled using the 2,080 figure.

These same lists are being forwarded to the regions this week. They will be used by the field for administering the provisions of Article 7, Section 3, of the 1981 National Agreement, and the provisions in the Memoranda of Understanding and Letter of Intent on Maximization. With the exception of Hempstead, Long Island, the post offices on these lists will remain in effect for the duration of the 1981 National Agreement, and no post office will be added to or deleted from the lists. These lists replace the lists transmitted to the unions under date of March 2, and are activated, prospectively, from this issuance.
