Recently, our representatives met in prearbitration discussion of the above-referenced grievance.

The issue in this grievance concerns the impact the mandatory use of bicycle helmets has on the ability of city letter carriers to employ uniform items to protect exposed skin from the sun.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agree to refer this issue to the National Joint Labor-Management Safety Committee as outlined under Article 14, Section 3.A, with the expectation that this matter will be addressed and resolved in that forum. In the event the issue is not resolved by December 31, 2013, or otherwise mutually extended, this case will be returned to its current status at arbitration.
